Each school hosts a student and parent registration/orientation session prior to school starting. The schools will inform parents of the date and time.

HOW CAN I REGISTER MY CHILD FOR KINDERGARTEN?

Registration forms and parent information will be provided by the school office.

WHAT INFORMATION WILL I NEED TO BRING TO REGISTER MY CHILD?

- Proof of age - birth certificate or baptismal record
- Doctor's name and phone number
- Present health conditions - any allergies or health concerns
- Your child's Saskatchewan Health Services number
- Child care information (if applicable)
- Emergency and contact information

DOES THE CHRIST THE TEACHER CATHOLIC SCHOOL DIVISION OFFER A PRE-KINDERGARTEN PROGRAM?

Yes! Our pre-kindergarten programs are offered at St. Alphonsus, St. Henry's Jr. and St. Mary's School 4 days per week with designated Family Activity Days.

PLAY-BASED LEARNING

We believe that purposeful, play-based, early learning sets the stage for future learning, health, and well-being. Play allows children to actively construct, challenge, and expand their own understandings and opens the door to new learning. Play is responsive to each child's unique learning style and capitalizes on his or her innate curiosity and creativity.

Teachers intentionally plan and create challenging, dynamic, play-based learning opportunities. Intentional teaching involves educators being deliberate and purposeful in creating play-based learning environments - because when children are playing, children are learning.

FREQUENTLY ASKED QUESTIONS

CAN NON-CATHOLIC STUDENTS ATTEND CHRIST THE TEACHER CATHOLIC SCHOOLS?

Families of all faiths are welcome if parents express a sincere desire to have their children taught in an environment where the development of Christian values is an intrinsic element of everyday school life.

Catholic traditions and values are the essence of our schools and it is essential that they be respected and supported by all members of our school community. Our students participate in all aspects of religious instruction and liturgical celebrations.

HOW OLD DOES MY CHILD HAVE TO BE TO START KINDERGARTEN?

All students must be five years of age by December 31st of the current school year.

SPIRITUAL DEVELOPMENT

A young child's way of being “religious” is to play, to be creative, to be curious, and to express wonderment. Through these natural childhood activities children come to know that God is present all around them as they grow, learn, and experience life.

Through their experiences in Kindergarten, young children learn that we are all made in God's image. Soon they are able to experience Jesus as the perfect image and likeness of God.

DIVERSE NEEDS

Our Kindergarten program is based on the belief that all children can learn. In the kindergarten room, children with a variety of needs and skill levels work and learn together. The teacher ensures that all children are included in activities that help them build on their own level of learning. In our Catholic schools, all children are valued as unique members of God's family.

Families are encouraged to inform the school about their child's special learning needs at the time of registration.
