# Minds on Math at Home

By now most parents are aware of the importance of reading to children at home, but did you know talking to your kids about math is important too?

Talking with your kids about math can greatly improve their attititude to math and their achievement. And the good news? No math skill is required! In fact, it would be healthy for your child to know that you are a learner too! Research shows that when we struggle with math concepts, we get better at math -even if we never get a correct answer or any answer at all! This column will give you ideas about ways to talk about math with your kids in a risk-free way.

I struggled with math as a child: Many people feel they are "not math people", but we now know this is not supported by research. Everyone has the ability to learn math. But how we feel about our math ability has a great impact on our achievement in math. Some parents are left with a feeling that they're not good at math because of their own school math experience. It is important that children do not hear those messages. Math does not need to be an elitist subject, reserved for physics and quantum science; it is also the



language of measurement, art, food, commerce, beauty, games, health, and nature. Real-world math is not restrictive and isolated; it is open, collaborative and

creative. Lets help children access this!

I'm not sure how to talk about math with my children: Great news! There are tons of resources to help parents bring math into the home. This column will be a great beginning. Talking about numbers and shapes with your child is as important as reading to them. How about some story books with math themes? Stay tuned to this column!


I don't understand the math my child is bringing home from school: This is normal! Unless you were immersed in the curriculum like a teacher or a student, you may not understand the math or the way math is taught. This will become more true as your kids advance up through the grades. It is not the intention that every skill and concept in math is remembered for life, but the habits of thinking and making sense become part of a mature mind and lay the foundations for thinking about the world around us in many ways. Rest assured it is not necessary to understand your child's math homework to be able to help them with their number sense and attitude towards mathematics. If you feel you want to better understand your child's math, ask your teacher for some videos you can watch.

#### Let's get started!

- -Encourage a growth mindset. Everyone can learn! We are still learning too.
- -Reassure your child that "being good at math" has nothing to do with speed. Slower processors often think more deeply. Some of our best mathematicians, composers, and artists are not speedy, and have no desire to be!
- -Be careful of praising kids for being "smart". This promotes a "fixed mindset"—the myth that we are born with ability or not. Instead, praise kids

for thinking hard, trying hard, and being open and patient.

-Don't disclose your own math anxiety to your child. Instead,



- -Embrace errors! We know that more brain activity is associated with making errors than with correct answers—in other words, we learn more by making mistakes!
- -Play games! Cards and dice = fun + learning!
  -Don't time things.

### Minds on Math at Home - Bedtime Math

The home is the child's first school, the parent is the child's first teacher, and reading is the child's first subject.

It's true that parents are a child's first teacher, and one thing parents know how to do is read to their kids at bedtime. There is plenty of research indicating the importance of this practice, but did you know there is also emerging research on the strength of incorporating mathematical thinking in reading?


Reading about math helps kids put numbers in context and apply them to situations.

Brains think more deeply and holistically about numbers when they are embedded in stories. Children remember concepts much more when they are inspired by situations and characters! Reading math stories to kids sparks curiosity about mathematical relationships, improves math vocabulary, strengthens reasoning, while reducing stressors that come with formal instruction. Adding some math to bedtime stories improves students' understanding and boosts achievement in math. It is also a guided way for parents to enter into mathematical conversations with children. Plus—kids love it!

The website "Bedtime Math" has free android and apple apps that give parents stories every day. There are parent notes that help point out the math within the stories. You can read some short stories free from the website, find them free on the app, or buy hardcover books online. https://bedtimemath.org/

Finally, Math Before Bed has interesting prompts for kids to talk about Math. They aren't <u>stories</u>, <u>but</u> images and prompts to promote a bedtime math discussion.

Try committing to a routine of incorporating just a little math talk at <u>bedtime</u>, and see if your child becomes more interested in math!

#### Dear Parents/Guardians:

The safety of our children is of top priority for all of us. We, the Good Spirit School Division and Christ the Teacher Catholic Schools, are involved in intensive safety training with our community partners. Together, we developed a plan for responding to high-risk behaviours. High-risk behaviours include, but are not limited to, possession of weapons, bomb threats and threats to injure oneself or others.

This letter is to inform you that GSSD/CTTCS school systems have a policy that requires principals to initiate a "threat assessment" in all cases of students displaying any type of high-risk behaviour. Should you wish to review the "Administrative Procedure 165: Safe Schools" or "Administrative Procedure 354: Threat Assessment", please visit our websites at either www.gssd.ca or www.christtheteacher.ca. The purpose of these assessments is to determine how best to support high-risk students so that their behaviour does not become hurtful or destructive. If your child comes home and tells you that a student has behaved in a threatening way at school, please advise your principal and be assured that your principal will be taking measures to deal with the situation in a positive and proactive manner. If your principal invites you to a meeting to discuss safety concerns about your own child, please be assured that the procedure is being followed and that the primary goal is safety, not punishment.

This letter is intended to serve our community with fair notice that we, as school communities, will not accept "no response" to a serious threat. Our goal is to respond to all threats in a professional manner that provides for a healthy and caring learning environment.

We are pleased to provide, in conjunction with our community partners, a safe environment for all of our students.


