Shared School Driveway

Please note, that school buses take PRIORITY in the driveway.

Halloween

Halloween is fast approaching and the children are excited about their costumes. As a staff. we have done some reflecting on the various costumes that are out there that truly depict negative and violent themes. One of our directives from administration is that "we must model and reinforce socially respective behaviour so teaching and learning can take place in a safe and caring environment". The costumes that depict blood, gore, weapons and violence create a negative image and engage children in conversations that are not healthy. There are a lot of costumes that we can wear that create humour, laughter and imagination. These are the types of costumes that we encourage your child to wear this year. Costumes that depict a violent theme are not allowed. Weapons, blood and gore are unacceptable accessories to the costume and will not be allowed. If

these are worn, we will ask the student to remove the costume and/or accessories. Please respect our concern regarding violent themes and inappropriate costumes. We wanted to share this information with families early to allow you plenty of time to plan for your child's costume. Note: We have done some research on "fun" costumes and have supplied a list for families to use as a guideline. Creating costumes from odds and ends, old clothes, boxes, etc. can be fun, inexpensive and a family activity. Examples: Fairy, Fireman, Pumpkin, Policeman, Scarecrow, Farmer, Ghost, King, Bat, Princess, Various Animals, Witch, Frankenstein ("friendly" monsters) Dragon.

Students are able to change into their costumes after lunch time.

There will be NO Halloween parade. Parents will NOT be allowed to help dress into costumes here at school.





Minds on Math at Home – Bedtime Math

The home is the child's first school. the parent is the child's first teacher. and reading is the child's first subject.

It's true that parents are a child's first teacher, and one thing parents know how to do is read to their kids at bedtime. There is plenty of research indicating the importance of this practice, but did you know there is also emerging research on the strength of incorporating mathematical thinking in reading?

Reading about math helps kids put numbers in context and apply them to situations. Brains think more deeply and holistically about numbers when they are embedded in stories. Children remember concepts much more when they are inspired by situations and characters! Reading math stories to kids sparks curiosity about mathematical relationships, improves math vocabulary, strengthens reasoning, while reducing stressors that come with formal instruction. Adding some math to bedtime stories improves students' understanding and boosts achievement in math. It is also a guided way for parents to enter into mathematical conversations with children. Plus—kids love it!

The website "Bedtime Math" has free android and apple apps that give parents stories every day. There are parent notes that help point out the math within the stories. You can read some short stories free from the website, find them free on the app, or buy hardcover. books online. https://bedtimemath.org/







Try committing to a routine of incorporating just a little math talk at <u>bedtime</u>, and see if your child becomes more interested in math!
