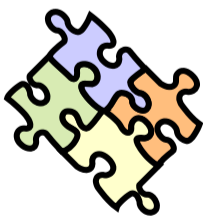
Nomination papers will be received by the above Returning Officers during office hours or electronically during the period from April 17, 2023 to May 19, 2023.



-  Those able to provide a two-year commitment to the work of the Council

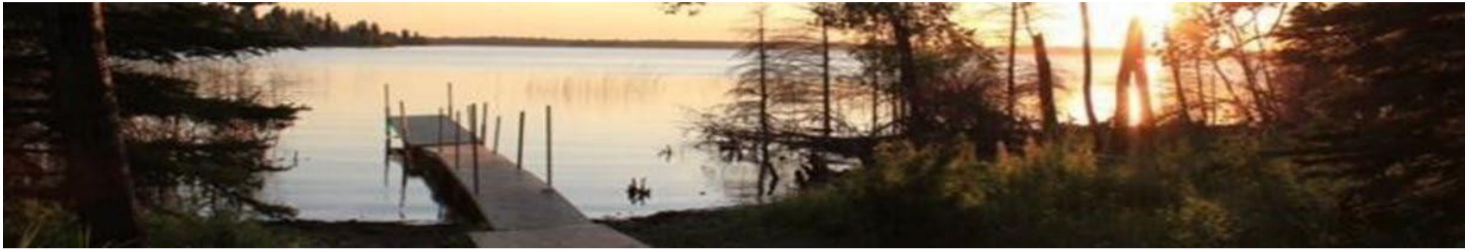
