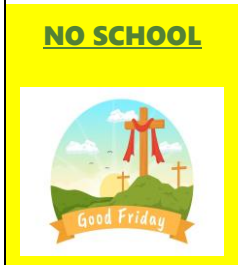

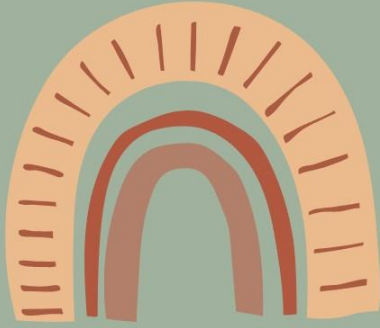

WISE WORDS FROM DR. BECKY

"If your child or teen tends to...

1. Push you away in the moments they need you the most, yelling "I hate you!" or "Leave me alone!"
2. Have huge reactions to seemingly small events, getting them labeled as "dramatic" or "difficult."
3. Blame you for things that are not at all your fault.

...then they might be a Deeply Feeling Kid. First: There's nothing wrong with your kid. And there's nothing wrong with you. Kids understand and experience the world in powerful ways, and they can teach us so much. Here's the thing: Parenting these kids is tricky. As they get older, parenting these kids can get even trickier. A 15-year-old has different meltdowns than a 5-year-old, and you can't quite pick up a 12-year-old and take them to their room like you could when they were 2."
