



Board Highlights (March 2018)

Notes from the March 12, 2018 Regular (Public) Meeting of the Christ the Teacher Roman Catholic School Division (CTTCS) Board of Education.

Second Quarter Fiscal Accountability Report

CTTCS Chief Financial Officer Delmar Zwirsky presented an interim financial update as of the end of the 2nd quarter of the 2017-2018 fiscal year. The Statement of Financial Activities for the period ending February 28, 2018 indicates the Division is in a strong financial position, and within anticipated ranges for revenues and expenditures for this reporting period.

Quarterly Transportation Report

This report is intended to provide updated fleet information and estimated usage, ride times, and accident information. Urban bus services are provided within the City of Melville (1 bus and 1 route) and the City of Yorkton (4 buses and 5 routes). Rural bus service is provided by Good Spirit School Division. Of note this quarter, security cameras were installed in buses in order to increase safety and accountability for students and for bus drivers. Parents have been notified of this change by their respective school. The cameras will allow for a review of any incidents that may occur during the transportation of students utilizing the in-town bus service and will be used to support any incident reports filed by bus drivers or complaints made by parents or students.

Submission of 2018-19 School Year Calendar to the Ministry of Education

A proposed 2018-2019 school calendar, developed in collaboration with Good Spirit School Division, Good Spirit Teachers' Association, Christ the Teacher Catholic Schools, and the Christ the Teacher Teachers' Association was approved by the Board. The proposed calendar will be submitted to the Ministry of Education for approval, and will be presented for final approval at the April Board Meeting. Highlights of the calendar include a total of 197 days and 960 instructional hours, a student start date of September 4, 2018, a 2-week Christmas break, a 5-day February break for students and staff, a 10-day Easter break, and the final Administration Day on June 28, 2018.

Information Technology Report

Superintendent of Education Chad Holinaty presented the anticipated 5-year Technology Hardware Renewal Projection. Included in this projection was the purchase of resources individual School Community Councils (SCCs) have supported the purchase for. The Division greatly appreciates the efforts and commitment our SCCs have demonstrated to supplement the technology available to students.

Susan Barton, teacher at Sacred Heart High School, led Board Members through a variety of activities to help demonstrate how students and staff have integrated technology to support achievement of learning outcomes.
