

Religion Grade 6 Outcomes and Indicators

Christ the Teacher Catholic Schools

Scripture and Church Teachings (ST)

(Themes: Bible, Traditions, Morality)

ST6.1 Determine connections between love, scripture, and daily life.

ST 6.1a Describes the message of love Jesus communicates in word and action in scripture.

ST 6.1b Describes the influence of the Good News on his or her life.

ST6.2 Determine the significance of traditions within the Church during Liturgical Seasons.

ST 6.2a Explains the importance of key traditions within the Church and their rationale to our Catholic faith perspective.

ST6.3 Explain the guidelines for moral living present in key elements of the Ten Commandments and The Beatitudes and Church teachings.

ST 6.3a Demonstrates the connections of everyday examples from daily life to the teachings of the Commandments and the Beatitudes.

Prayer and Celebration (PC)

(Personal Relationship with God, Relationship with God through Community)

PC6.1 Engage in the prayer life of the school and classroom.

PC 6.1a Finds prayers and explains the meaningfulness to self.

PC6.2 Develop an appreciation for the celebratory traditions of the Church.

PC 6.2a Contributes to preparing a celebration such as devotions, Celebration of the Word, intercessory prayers, scripture reflections, blessings, celebration of the Eucharist.

PC6.3 Discern the importance of the signs and symbols of the sacraments and liturgical seasons to his/her personal experience and faith journey.

PC 6.3a Determines the importance and meaning of specific rituals and symbols of Advent, Epiphany, Lent, and Easter.

Witness (WS)

(Thoughts, Deeds and Words)

WS6.1 Compare my own actions with the standards of love that Jesus modelled.

WS 6.1a Examines human sinfulness through an examination of conscience (such as the Ten Commandments, the Beatitudes, Seven Deadly Sins, Seven Precepts of the Church) in preparation for the sacrament of Reconciliation.

WS 6.1b Describes the connection between Jesus' mission and his or her own mission in life.

WS6.2 Develop an understanding of the response of God's call required in us through word and action.

WS 6.2a Draws conclusions about God's revelation with examples from the Bible in the Old and New Testament.

WS 6.2b Demonstrates an understanding of God's revelation through virtuous behaviour in everyday life.

WS6.3 Examine the connection between God's call to love and issues of justice in society.

WS 6.3a Associates self-selected scriptural passages that reveal God's call to love to examples of everyday injustices.

WS 6.3b Describes challenges of exhibiting God's love in society.

WS 6.3c Describes examples of how people have overcome the challenges of injustices in secular society.
