

Religion Grade 9 Outcomes and Indicators

Christ the Teacher Catholic Schools

Scripture and Church Teachings (ST)

ST 9.1 Synthesize the teachings of Jesus as revealed through his life and word.

ST 9.1a Names and explains the Beatitudes and recognizes them as the summary of virtues Christians are asked to demonstrate.

ST 9.1b Identifies ways Jesus lived out love in a Christ-like way.

ST 9.2 Develop a concept of moral decision making based on Jesus' teachings and the tradition of the Catholic Church.

ST 9.2a Explains the moral teachings of the Ten Commandments and recognize how they affect one's own life.

ST 9.2b Makes connections between our physical, intellectual, social, and emotional facets and our relationship with God and Church traditions.

ST 9.2c Activates the decision-making process through Scripture and prayer.

ST 9.3 Discern the impact of our dignity as a creation of God on our relationship with ourselves and others.

Prayer and Celebration (PC)

PC 9.1 Engage in the prayer life of the school and classroom.

Witness (W)

W9.1 Determine the role of the Beatitudes and the Commandments in the formation of Christian character.

W9.1a Identifies the meaning of the Beatitudes and translates that into the virtues Catholic people are called to live by.

W9.1b Expresses the meaning of the Commandments and recognizes them as the basis of Catholic character.

W9.2 Analyze the impact of the different components that make up the human person on Christian wholeness.

W9.2a Connects our Catholic faith to our intellectual, physical, spiritual, social, and emotional facets.

W9.3 Appraise the impact of our relationship with God on our relationships with others.

W9.3a Describes what it means to live life in Christ and recognizes some of the joys and demands involved.

W9.3b Demonstrates our commitment to the way of God through acts of service.

W9.4 Compare our actions with the standard of love that Jesus modeled.

W9.4a Identifies how Jesus lived out a Christ-like love and compares it to our own choices of how we live our life.

W9.4b Distinguishes between a healthy relationship and an unhealthy relationship based on scripture such as 1 Corinthians 13:4-8 to guide decisions for living Christ-like.

W9.4c Explains how Christ's unconditional love can help us live a life of justice, forgiveness and compassion.
