

ACTIVITIES IN OUR SCHOOLS


August 26th – All staff from Christ the Teacher Catholic Schools began the year with an Opening Mass at St. Gerard's Roman Catholic Church in Yorkton.


Following the mass, Bishop Bolen and Lyndon Linklater shared their messages of the importance of Truth and Reconciliation.
